Matthew 6:9-13 (ESV)

9 Pray then like this:

11 Give us this day our daily bread,

12 and forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors.

13 And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.”

Guide to the Lord's Prayer

(adapted from Dr. Larry Lea's "Could You Not Tarry One Hour?")

1. Our Father in heaven

- Thank God that you can call Him "Father" because of what Jesus did on the cross.
- Scriptures to consider: Romans 8:14-17, Psalm 103:13, Proverbs 13:11-12, 2 Samuel 7:8-16

2. Hallowed be your name

- Praise God for all the aspects of who He is and honor His name as Holy.
- Declare that He is our Righteousness, our Healer, our Provider, our Shepherd, our Peace. An ever-present help in times of trouble.

3. Your kingdom come, your will be done

- Pray that Jesus would reign over your life, your family, your church, our nation and all the earth.
- Pray for the peace of Jerusalem. (Psalm 122:6)

4. Give us this day our daily bread

- Believe that as we are in the will of God, He will provide our needs. Be specific and tenacious.

5. Forgive us our debts, as we forgive others

- Ask God to forgive you.
- Forgive and release others who have sinned against you.

6. Lead us not into temptation

- Put on the whole armor of God (Ephesians 6:10-18) as you face the trials and temptations of this world.
- Pray supernatural protection around yourself and family against the schemes of the enemy.

7. Yours is the kingdom, power and glory forever

- Boldly declare by faith that Jesus has authority to do all the things we ask.
- Return to praise as you hope for Jesus' return. (Titus 2:13)
